In addition, he announced that if anyone is interested in call sign patches, there is a ham in Benton, Illinois, who will make them for \$7.50 per patch; see Ernie for contact information.

Barry Doyle, ACØWL, said that he needs more operators for Skywarn activity.

Penny Wheeler, KDØGXZ, passed around the sign-up sheet for Field Day and worked through some items on the needs list. Ernie Chiles, WØRMS, has received the OCF wire antenna. Jodie Rouse, KDØLDE, will do the educational table for the youth activity and will place the event on Facebook. Penny passed around the envelope to prepay \$3 per person for the fried chicken. Eric Bennett, KEØATR, will bring a digital logging program to Field Day. The potluck will begin at 6 p.m. in Klaus Park. Everyone should bring his own drink; also bring either a side dish, a salad, chips with dip, or a dessert. A lawn chair would also be useful.

New Business

Ernie Chiles, WØRMS, reported that he had followed up with the Ludwig family regarding the donation of ham equipment to the club, but there was nothing to donate.
